### a. <u>Trustee report- Melyssa Bowen</u>

<u>Discovery Trails Online School</u> - staff presented how to support students and enhance social and emotional support online. The online school grew by 214 students this year.

### Approved budget priorities 2024/2025

- provide direct resources to support students learning, focusing on numeracy and literacy.
- support students and staff wellness
- enhance facilities, technology and infrastructure
- target operating reserve balance at end of 2024/2025
- transportation at 0.5 per cent to 1 per cent

The Board has approved the 2024/2025 budget development process. A draft budget will be done in late May for consideration.

<u>New school in Langdon</u> is a high school. The school's name is Horseshoe Crossing. The school is still under construction and will be ready for students in September 2024.

<u>Board planning committee</u> of labor relations committee terms of reference were updated. There will be a meeting March 7th.

<u>Heron's Crossing</u> has shared how their Learning Commons helps by serving as a hub for literacy for teachers connecting K-4 students with hands on tasks.

# Infrastructure Maintenance and Renewal Projects

- RVS received a grant of 2,795,116 for imr 2023/2024 year
- All project from 2022/2023 have been complete
- 22 out of 27 school have been retrofitted with better front door security. The province announced funding for schools March 1. Three new schools: two k-8 for Airdrie and a k-8 in Cochrane. Also included design funding for a high school in Airdrie and a kindergarten - grade 9 in Chestermere.

### b. Principal Report - Shawna Neis

#### Kindness Ambassadors

- Thanks to the parent council for supporting the kindness Ambassadors.
- Students were nominated by their peers, two per classroom. The students that won got a t-shirt and a certificate. All the students that won were very surprised.
- In an assembly a family feud game was played teacher vs the kindness ambassadors, put together by the leadership.

<u>Bert Church High</u> - teacher came to Meadowbrook to let the grade 8s pick their option for the school year. 180 families went to the Bert Church open house for the new grade 9 students that will be attending the school.

### <u>Fees</u>

- Guidelines for increasing costs for school fees, like options, field trips etc. can increase by 3% or \$5.00, it can't increase by more than 10% whichever is less.
- Foods and construction went up more because of the cost of material, has to be complete by April 10

- Food Drive March 18-22, then the students constructed bulldog pride with the donations.
- Book drive next two weeks
- Student lead conferences March 26-27, 4:00pm -7:00pm.
